OPERATORY

This is the clinic treatment area where the exemplary work of our students and faculty is performed and thousands of clients from our community are helped every year. From a bariatric operatory, to an operatory with wheel chair accessibility, we have the ability to treat patients from every walk of life.

WAITING AREAS

From the interactive touch-screen self-check-in stations to the comfortable seating arrangements, these areas are specifically designed to be a relaxing environment for the patients as they await their procedures.

STUDY AREAS

These areas give the students a quiet space to commit themselves to their studies and prepare for the hard work they will need to put into the day to become oral health professionals.

CLASSROOMS

The classrooms provide a small learning environment for the students to obtain the knowledge that is needed to become future leaders in the industry.

CONSULTATION ROOMS

The consultation rooms are private areas for clients to sit with their clinicians and discuss their procedures and have any questions they need answered in a safe environment.

ROUNDS ROOM

These rooms give a space for students to gather and discuss complicated cases. This environment allows the students to use their individual experiences and turn them into a collective leaning opportunity.

LABORATORY

This is where the preparation of work such as implants and crowns takes place. The types of labs include: an orthodontist lab, 2 undergraduate labs, an oral maxillofacial lab, an AEGD lab, and a graduate prosthetics lab.
